

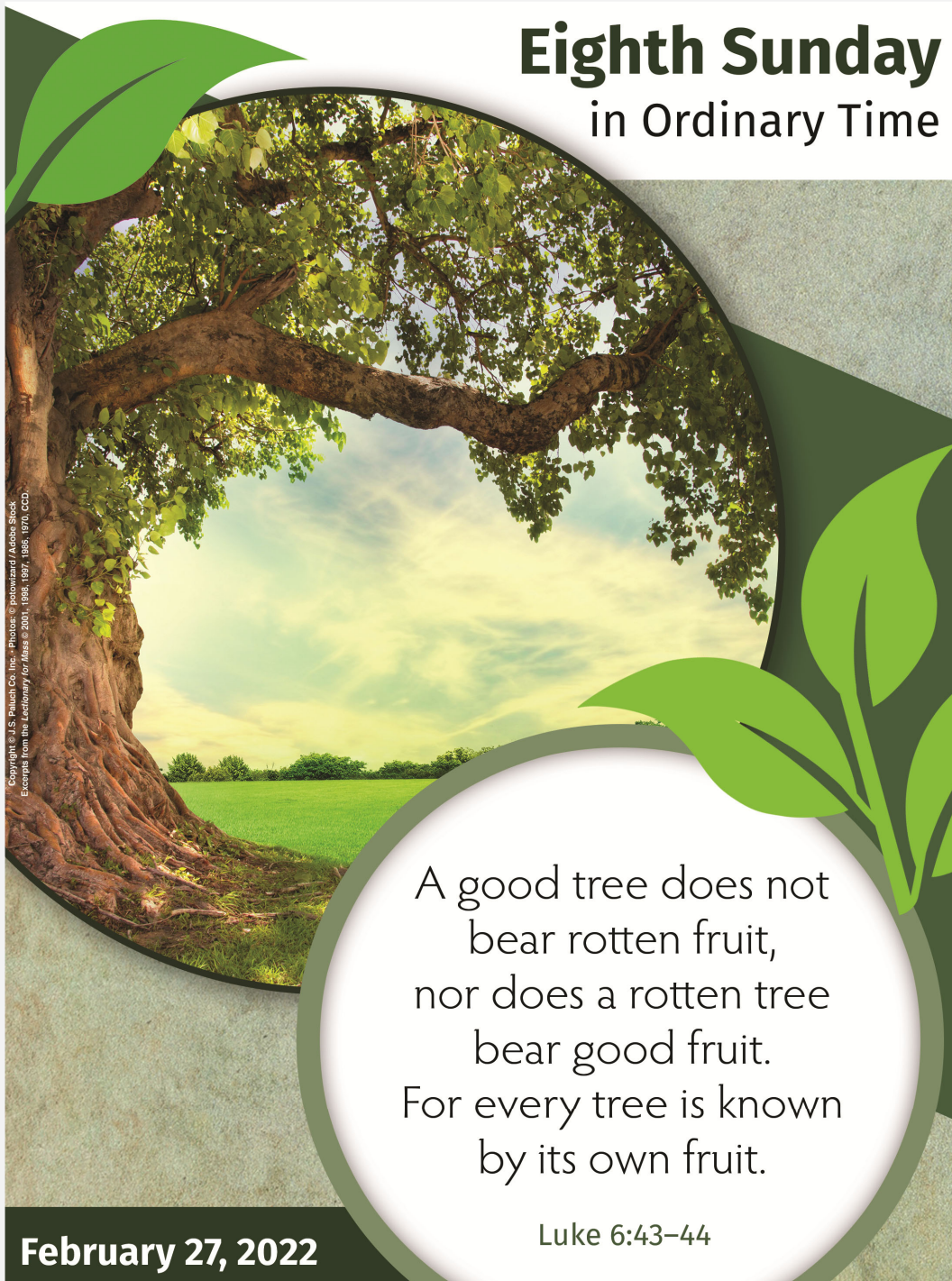

Fr. Marty's Musings

The coat of arms of the Archdiocese of Chicago since 1880 depicts the mythological phoenix rising from flames. The image symbolizes the resurrection of Jesus, but also recalls the rebirth of the city following the Great Chicago Fire of October, 1871. The original Holy Name Church was destroyed in the fire and rose from the ashes in 1875 as our present Cathedral.

Today we carry out a tradition celebrating new life springing from ashes. We burn palms from last year's entrance into Holy Week for Ash Wednesday. Palms have dried and withered, but the fire's remnants will mark our foreheads in penance and commitment towards renewal.



Lent begins Wednesday, and Christians feast before the fast. Mardi Gras or Carnival are times to celebrate before the sacrifices of Lent. Mardi Gras means "Fat Tuesday," the day before Ash Wednesday. Carnival celebrates before a "Farewell to meat" (Christians formerly abstained from meat through Lent).

We have the Lent issue of Five Minutes with the Word booklets of brief daily reflections. Please take a time each day for spiritual nourishment. Commit to the Lenten virtues of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.



A parishioner asked me on Sunday for the text from my message at the beginning of Mass last weekend.

This morning/Yesterday, I celebrated with our daily worshippers the Mass of Holy Mary, Mother of Unity. At this difficult time, let us appeal as a community to our patroness for her healing love. We are united in our sadness. Despite what you may have heard, I did what I could to chart a path forward with Mr. Mathius and our beloved school. It was a fair and reasonable path. I sincerely hoped

that Mr. Mathius would accept, but disappointedly, he declined. I cannot be more specific in the details because at the meeting, Mr. Mathius was assured that we would keep details confidential.

We are a Catholic Christian community called to unity as the Body of Christ. That is what we reply "Amen" to at Communion. We are hurting, but I pray that we do not allow that hurt to cause additional harm to our parish and school, especially as we prepare to welcome our sisters and brothers of St. Bernadette. Mr. Mathius states that he would not want that.

Please keep our tremendous students, wonderful faculty, and Mr. Mathius in your prayers. I assure you that they are all in mine.

I have mentioned to a couple parishioners that aside from the deaths of my brother James and my parents, these have been the saddest and most difficult days of my priesthood. And perhaps with even more extended tears. It is difficult for us all, but let us support each other. That is our faith.

We are called to Communion, and as we ready to celebrate the Eucharist, I offer the ending prayer of Holy Mary, Mother of Unity:

Lord God, through your holy gifts which we have received on this memorial of holy Mary, Mother of unity, pour out upon us the Spirit of gentleness and peace, that we may work together in harmony and so hasten the coming of your kingdom. Through Christ our Lord.

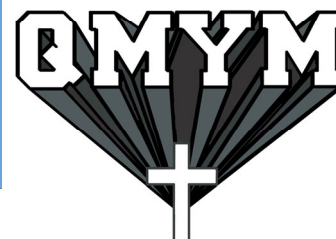

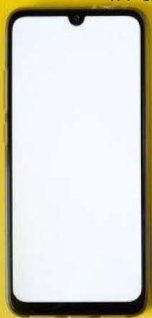

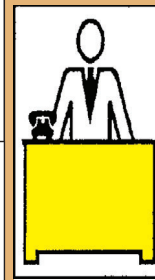
